



DANGER!!

Poison hemlock is poisonous. All parts of this plant; leaves, stems, flowers and fruits contain alkaloids. The poison (alkaloids) can be seen as red blotches or streaks on the stem. The stem is hollow and smooth, with out hairs.

If plant is cut, place in a plastic garbage bag and dispose into trash.

DO NOT place any cutting of this plant into compose piles. **DO NOT** burn plant parts as the smoke may be poisonous to breath. Dried and dead stocks of plants can remain poisonous for 1-3 years.
