OFFICE REPORT

Alison Halpern

The Board reviewed the WSNWCB Office Report, July 2010, Cindy Orr and Alison Halpern

Publications and education material that were recently printed include:

- 44,000 revised knapweed brochures.
- 37,000 Western Garden Wise.
- 17,000 Eastern Garden Wise.
- 80,000 Newly created knotweed brochures.
- Early detection rapid response postcards for poison hemlock, Mediterranean sage, shiny geranium, giant hogweed, and buffalobur.

The Board discussed butterfly bush including:

 The Nursery Advisory Committee would consider a WSDA quarantine on butterfly bush in 2012 and would like a letter from the Board.

- Butterfly bush is currently listed as a class B weed. It is designated in some eastern counties as well as the Thurston County Nisqually watershed.
- Butterfly bush seed is very tiny and distributed by wind and water.
- Observed colors of escaped butterfly bush flowers.

Action Item: Alison will write a letter to the Nursery Advisory Committee proposing a WSDA quarantine on butterfly bush in 2012.

WSDA REPORT

WSDA submitted a request with US Forest Service for 2011 Forest Health funds and is waiting on the response.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Alison Halpern

The Board reviewed documents titled Budget Summary June 2010 (pg.1), Weed Board Projects (pg.2), State Weed Board (pg.3), Weed Board Education (pg.4), FY09 Weed Board (pg.5), FY09 Education (pg.6), Special Projects 56025, and Special Projects FY10

Budget Report

A discrepancy of \$5,560, discussed at the WSNWCB meeting in March, was the result of an incorrect amount entered into the Excel spreadsheet used for the report. It was corrected in the file.

End of year expenditure summary

Unspent funds include:

- A \$5,000 buffer remaining at the end of the fiscal year (6/30/10).
- Staff was unable obtain signatures for an interagency agreement of approximately \$1,200, funded by special projects, for a shiny geranium survey.

Year-end purchases include:

- \$40,000 was spent on printing publications (listed in the Office Report above page 2).
- Four GPS units with ARC Pad licenses (to be administered by Greg Haubrich).
- Herbicide for county use in early detection rapid response. Greg Haubrich is storing herbicide for the eastern WA and Tim Miller is storing herbicide for western WA.
- Two cameras and macro lens.
- A table top display.
- Office supplies.
- Software updates.
- Shelving for new storage units and movers to help transfer publications and misc. board assets.

The Board discussed:

- O Delivery of eight additional inexpensive, digital cameras (planned for county use) was delayed and did not arrive before the required June 30 deadline. The purchase had to be cancelled.
- o The Board purchased 34 quarts of Milestone herbicide. Roundup Pro herbicide and Competitor surfactant were also purchased.

- o The herbicide is intended to assist counties with early detection rapid response to class A weeds and also for use by the SEWA CWMA.
- o In July of 2009 OFM mandates reduced the board's budget by \$11,000. In May of 2010 the \$11,000. was reinstated.
- o Budget cuts in FY11 are as yet undetermined.
- o Cindy's hours were reduced to 30 hours per week due to budget cuts.
- o Budget cuts, if any, for travel in FY11 are as yet undetermined.
- o The Budget committee discussed recommending future budget cuts being taken first from travel, then printing, then the unspent salary of the vacant position.
- o WSDA agriculture inspection programs, as well as boards and commission staff, are exempt from furlough days.
- O Staff is using a newly designed logo and uses letterhead with the official state of Washington seal. The Board reviewed an example of the new WSNWCB website homepage.
- o Board classes are listed on the OFM website.

Action Item: Mary will email board members the WSNWCB class status.

Add English holly, Ilex aquifolium, to the class C list.	A meeting for the purpose of determining the impact of listing English holly was held on 6/2. Ken Bajema, Alison Halpern, Tim Miller, holly growers, and a reporter attended.
	 The Board discussed: Holly growers are concerned that listing English holly will create a stigma that might impact businesses.
	 Further evaluation is necessary to determine the impact of holly on natural areas.
	 WSDA has not taken a position on holly, but in general WSDA is uneasy and cautious about any agricultural crop being listed.
	 Crop plants currently on the Noxious Weed List such as cereal rye
	• Further evaluation is necessary to determine which counties will enforce control if English holly is listed.
	 Alison reminded the Board that the Noxious Weed Committee report was intended to be a general update of the Committee and not a discussion of the proposals.
Add Japanese eelgrass, Zostera japonica, to the class C list.	The NWC held a meeting on May 25 to discuss listing Japanese eelgrass. Representatives of WDFW, ECY, and DNR attended as well as shellfish growers, Tim Miller, Kathy Hamel, and Alison Halpern.
	The Board discussed:
	 ECY made a decision that they will not cover marine or estuarine under their aquatic plant and algae NPDES permit.
	 The NPDES permit coverage administered by WSDA allows, but does not require, WSDA to contract with other entities for treatment

WWHAM

Alison Halpern

Alison submitted a concept paper to WSDA for an agency sponsored bill authorizing the State Weed Board to administer the WWHAM program which includes authority for the Board to charge and retain fees, and to employ inspectors. WSDA does not support an agency requested legislative bill with the primary reason being concern with potential liability in having the board administer a permanent, regulatory, inspection program. The Weed Board currently has no regulatory authority outside the State Noxious Weed List, and it has no authorization or system to collect fees or obtain reimbursement for twine.
