Noxious Weed List Additions and Designation Changes for 2022

- Hanging sedge, *Carex pendula*, *Carex pendula subsp. pendula* and *Carex pendula subsp. agastachys*, as a Class B noxious weed, and designated in region 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and region 2 except for King County.

VOTE	Dirk Veleke	Moved that the proposal for adding hanging sedge as a Class B noxious weed, and designated in region 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and region 2 except for King County, to be considered at the public hearing

- Rough chervil, *Chaerophyllum temulum*, as a Class B noxious weed, and designated in region 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and region 2 except for King County.

VOTE	Dirk Veleke	Moved that the proposal for adding rough chervil as a Class B noxious weed, and designated in region 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and region 2 except for King County, to be considered at the public hearing

- Wild basil, *Clinopodium vulgare*, as a Class B noxious weed, and designated in region 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, and region 3 except for Skamania County.

VOTE	Janet Spingath	Moved that the proposal for adding wild basil as a Class B noxious weed, and designated in region 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, and region 3 except for Skamania County, to be considered at the public hearing

- Green alkanet, *Pentaglottis sempervirens*, as a Class C noxious weed.

VOTE	Janet Spingath	Moved that the proposal for adding green alkanet as a Class C noxious weed to be considered at the public hearing

	<i>The Board</i>	All in favor, no opposition, motion carried.

- Crack willow, *Salix fragilis*, was proposed to be listed as a Class C noxious weed. The Noxious Weed Committee recommends revisiting this species next year, once they have received more information from Yakima County, and others.
 - No motion to move crack willow to the public hearing.
- Common tansy, *Tanacetum vulgare*, reclassified from a Class C to a Class B noxious weed, and designated in Clallam County of region 1, Kitsap and San Juan counties of region 2, Cowlitz and Lewis counties of region 3, and Adams and Lincoln counties of region 5.

VOTE	Jerry Hendrickson	Moved that the proposal for reclassifying common tansy from a Class C to a Class B noxious weed, and being designated in Clallam County of region 1, Kitsap and San Juan counties of region 2, Cowlitz and Lewis counties of region 3, and Adams and Lincoln counties of region 5, to be considered at the public hearing

- Wild carrot, *Daucus carota*, a Class C noxious weed, clarification, to add wording to *exclude Daucus carota subsp. sativus* (garden carrot), from the noxious weed list, to be grown commercially or for food.

VOTE	Dirk Veleke	Moved for wild carrot clarification, to add wording to exclude <i>Daucus carota subsp. sativus</i> (garden carrot), from the noxious weed list, to be grown commercially or for food.

- Common bugloss, *Anchusa officinalis*, a Class B noxious weed’s scientific name has a typo in WAC 16-750, and is erroneously listed as *Lycopsis arvensis*, which is the scientific name for annual bugloss.
 - This change announcement will move forward to hearing.
